Anticipation Guides Improve Reading Comprehension ...

Definition: "An anticipation guide is a comprehension strategy that is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and build curiosity about a new topic," ("Anticipation Guide," 2014). Before reading the text, several statements about the passage are read to the students.

Anticipation Guide - Comprehension Strategies

Anticipation guides stimulate students' interest in a topic and set a purpose for reading. They teach students to make predictions, anticipate the text, and verify their predictions. They connect new information to prior knowledge and build curiosity about a new topic.

Anticipation Guide - STRATEGIES

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An Anticipatory Reading Guide was created for the students to use to record answers and direct their reading focus (Figure 3). The teacher created a three column spreadsheet where the first column told the student which paragraph to read. The second column stated what to look for and the third column gave space to record responses.

Using Anticipatory Reading Guides to Improve Elementary ...

Anticipation Guide + Character POV To help students understand point of view (POV), you can use an anticipation guide where students write down how they feel about the statements. Then, after they read the story, they write down how a specific character feels about the same statements.

Anticipation Guide

Anticipation Guides (Herber, 1978) are typically a list of statements related to a topic that act as scaffolding for student understanding of the text. Students indicate if they agree or disagree with each of the statements.

As stated on the Anticipation Guide itself, "Anticipation guides help engage students by activating prior knowledge and stimulating student interest before reading." Students read the eleven statements and decide if they agree or disagree with the statements, recording their answers in the first column.
